We take very seriously the worldwide concerns that metals mined in the conflict areas of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) may be making their way into the materials supply chain. We support the efforts of the Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI) and the Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC) Extractives involved in the development of the Conflict-Free Smelter Program (CFSP) to enable sourcing of conflict-free minerals. Policy Statement

GeneSiC Semiconductor Inc. is committed to sourcing components and materials that share our values around human rights, ethics, and environmental responsibility. GeneSiC Semiconductor Inc. is not engaged in the procurement of metals directly that may be associated with conflict and our policy requires our supply chain partners to certify in writing that they do not knowingly purchase gold, tantalum, tin, and/or tungsten from conflict areas. We are encouraging our direct suppliers to purchase materials form smelters who are listed on the Conflict-Free Smelter Program (CFSP) Compliant Smelter List and have been certified as conflict-free through the Conflict-Free Smelter Program (CFSP) administered by the Electronics Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC) and the Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI). Based on this, GeneSiC Semiconductor, Inc. confirms that any of the aforementioned metals utilized by our supply chain and contained in our products are not derived or sourced from mines in the conflict areas.
